

## WASECA COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS-FEBRUARY 15, 2011

The Waseca County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, February 15, 2011, in the Commissioners Room, 300 N. State Street, Waseca, Minnesota. Members present were Mike Hintz, Blair Nelson, Richard Androli and Jim Peterson. Dan Kuhns arrived at 10:12 a.m.

Others present were Joyce Oliver, Auditor-Treasurer; Marilee Reck, Human Services Director; Paul Dressler, County Attorney; Drew Amo, News Reporter; Mark Vagts, Assessor; Mark Leiferman, Planning & Zoning Director; Laura Elvebak, MnCOG; Dennis Dinneen, Veterans Service Officer; Brian Tomford, Maintenance; Vernon Benson; Matt Gingelee, MSU Intern; Steve Peterson, Court Services Director; Bruce Kimmel, Ehlers & Associates.

Chair Hintz called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. Roll call was taken and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Chair Hintz asked for public comment. There was none.

Peterson moved and Androli seconded the motion to approve the agenda with the following additions: Bills from New Richland Sportsman Club, Southern MN Tourism and US Hwy 14 Partnership. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark Leiferman, Planning & Zoning Administrator, introduced Matthew Gingelee, MSU Intern, who will be working with the City of Janesville in their P& Z planning.

Mark informed the board about the Farmer Forum on March 31, 2011, at Farmamerica.

Mark also spoke about different items that the Planning Commission is considering and wondered if the board had any concerns that they want him to take back to the commission.

Androli moved and Peterson seconded the motion to approve the consent agenda with the exception of F, which is to be removed for discussion. Motion carried unanimously.

- a. Approve February 1, 2011 board minutes.
- b. Approve Auditor, Commissioner, Human Services and expense bills.
- c. Approve hiring Suzie Root as Property Appraiser at C41-Step C, beginning February 15, 2011.
- d. Approve hiring Joseph Babcock as Court Services Officer starting March 7, 2011. Salary is set by the State of Minnesota.
- e. Approve out-of-state travel for Steve Peterson to attend the MACPO conference at no cost to the county.

~~f. MDVA Grant to Purchase VSO County Van~~

g. Approve Human Services report.

h. Approve SCHA Delegation Agreement amendment for 2011. The amendment addresses policy changes as well as rates to be paid to the county for services.

Discussion ensued concerning the MDVA grant removed from the consent agenda. Peterson moved and Nelson seconded the motion to approve the grant contract with the MN Department of Veterans Affairs. The grant is to be used for the purchase of a new van and is in the amount of \$20,000. Motion carried unanimously.

Mike Hintz informed the board that March is declared Minnesota Foodshare Month and everyone is encouraged to support their local food shelf center.

Marilee Reck requested to refill the vacated temporary social worker position in Children's Unit and to continue the position at 3 days per week, as originally approved, for not more than a total of 67 days total. Androli moved and Nelson seconded the motion to approve filling the temporary position. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark Vagts, Assessor, requested hiring the vacated Administrative Assistant position. Discussion ensued and the request was tabled until after the public hearing.

Chair Hintz called the public hearing to order at 10:09 a.m. for re-determination of benefits and damages on county ditches 23, 29 and 30.

Present were Wesley Tennis, Ditch Viewer; Chris Christianson, Ditch Viewer; Robert Hansen, Ditch Viewer; Curt Deter, Rinke Noonan; and landowners Dennis Witt, Marvin Guse, Herbert Guse, Duane Flemming, Darrell Flemming, Eugene Scheffert, Alan Flemming, Carl Guse, Robert Marzinske and Louis Marzinske.

Proponents, opponents and neutral parties were invited to address the board. Darrell Flemming spoke to the board about the 1 rod grass buffer strip that is required on the county ditches. His family has a portion of land that is land-locked on CD 30 and is full of natural growth and trees. There is no feasible way to till and seed that area. He presented pictures of the property. Kurt Deter gave the opinion that it should be left as is until it causes a problem in the future and that an order amendment will be drawn and attached to the final redetermination of benefits addressing the issue. The 30 day appeal period will commence after the order is drawn up.

Another issue is that CD 29 and CD 30 drain into private ditches before reaching JD 11. Kurt Deter recommended that the Ditch Authority obtain a drainage easement from the landowners in order to maintain or repair that part of the system if needed.

No other issues were addressed and the public hearing was adjourned at 10:29 a.m.

Peterson moved and Androli seconded the motion to adopt the following resolutions and order to adopt and confirm the viewer's report for County Ditches 23, 29 and 30. The order amendment on CD 30 on the Flemming property will be drawn up by Kurt Deter and attached to the resolution. Motion carried unanimously.

Brian Tomford, Maintenance Foreman, presented bids for snow removal equipment. Two bids were received. Androli moved and Kuhns seconded the motion to accept the low bid from Ag Power for not more than \$18,305.04 including complete assembly and delivery, to be paid out of the building fund. Motion carried unanimously.

Brian gave a building committee update.

Verner Benson is requesting revision of a Conditional Use Permit granted a year ago to construct, operate and maintain 3 lighted outdoor advertising signs (billboards). Mark Leiferman informed the board that the billboards have not been constructed yet and would recommend extending the permit for one year with the following four changes:

- a. That the new permit be only in the name of Verner Benson.
- b. That the sign be allowed to be lit from the bottom rather than from the top if the code is amended to allow such lighting.
- c. That the permit will be considered activated if only one of the signs is constructed.
- d. That the permit allows mono-pole signs as well as a multi-pole sign.

Androli moved and Peterson seconded the motion to approve the request with the conditions appended. Motion passed unanimously.

Laura Elvebak, MN Valley Council of Governments, presented options for an Interim County Administrator including hiring from a list of interested parties or obtaining MnCOG services, which is a service the MVCOG can provide to the County at a reduced price due to Waseca County's membership in the MVCOG. Bruce Kimmel, Ehlers & Associates, was asked if recruitment and placement is something that Ehlers & Associates provides as a service. Kimmel indicated it is not. Discussion ensued.

Kuhns moved and Androli seconded the motion to contract with Laura Elvebak, MnCOG, as Interim Administrator, for 12 weeks beginning February 16, 2011, for an average 24 hours per week at a rate of \$23.00 per hour including mileage. The position will be reviewed at the end of 12 weeks. Motion carried unanimously.

A County Board work session will be scheduled after the next regular meeting on March 1, 2011, to discuss administrator recruitment or alternatives.

County Day at the Capitol is set for Wednesday, March 2, 2011.

Commissioner Peterson presented a bill from New Richland Sportsman Club for repairs for \$971.62 from the St. Olaf Lake Agreement monies. Androli moved and Nelson seconded the motion to approve the bill. Motion carried unanimously.

Chair Hintz presented a bill from US Hwy 14 Partnership for membership dues at \$1,500.00. Kuhns moved and Peterson seconded the motion to continue on with the membership because of its importance to Waseca County and the US Hwy 14 corridor. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

Kuhns moved and Androli seconded the motion to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried by unanimous vote and the meeting was adjourned at 11:55 a.m.
